Mellow as her Hawaiian vibe, Ramona Solatorio would knock your block off during her 10 years as a professional roller derby skater for the L.A. Thunderbirds. Rough-and-tumble women would battle for position on a banked track and whip each other around the pack to score points for taking the lead. "I was watching the game in Hawaii and I said, 'One of these days, I'll be down on that track.'" Shortly after moving to Los Angeles in the 1960s, Ramona tried out and made the team, renting her first pair of skates. She traveled the U.S., Australia and Japan for eight months during the season and came away "bruised from head to toe." She suffered 13 broken bones. "All in all, I've had a very good life," Ramona says. "I'm happy. I'm retired, having a good time, just enjoying life."



Club plans for Oktoberfest

The German-American Social Club of Nevada has set a tentative date of Sept. 28 for its annual Oktoberfest, the club's largest revenue generator of the year.

At its July 11 meeting, the newly elected board discussed the pros and cons of joining with the City of Las Vegas in presenting Oktoberfest at Fifth Street School, which generated about \$9,000 at past events, or holding the celebration at the clubhouse as we did last year, bringing in about \$4,600 over two days.

Trustee Erika Gries mentioned that it's a ton of work loading trucks with food and equipment and transporting it to the school, and it requires numerous club volunteers to commit their entire Saturday. The city invited GASCON to participate free for the first few years of Oktoberfest at Fifth Street School, then started requiring financial reimbursement when city officials realized our profits, Erika added.

Trustee Silvia Brunn agreed with Erika that it's better to have Oktoberfest at the club and save everyone from loading the trucks.

Also at the meeting:

Secretary Linda Snyder said the club received 174 membership renewals. She called upon more support for jazz night, which profited only \$78 on the first Tuesday in July. We need servers, bartenders and door cashiers.

Treasurer Alwine Cushman reported a loss of \$1,297 in June, which included paying workers' compensation insurance for community service. Saturday dinners have been slow, and we're paying \$14,000 a year in utilities.

The board discussed club policies for giving free drinks to cooks, meals to community service workers and the expense of providing to-go containers for dinners. Also, free coffee adds up with the cost of the coffee, sugar and creamers.
