

You can count on a loyal soldier to jump into the fray when the going gets rough, and that's precisely what Mark Cushman did when he signed up to run for German-American Club president this year, amid the coronavirus pandemic that had turned the club and the world topsyturvy. He was the lone candidate. "It (voting) was coming up and nobody else signed up and we didn't want the club to fall apart," Mark said. "We signed up to keep the club alive." His wife, Alwine, was voted club treasurer, her second term in that position. Retiring after 20 years' service in the U.S. Air Force, Mark embarked on a 19-year second career with a civilian defense contractor, fieldtesting military equipment. He said he doesn't know if he's qualified to be club president, but he was voted into the position, and he's giving it his best shot. Mark and Alwine, who is of German heritage, joined the club to be around Germans and for the opportunity to speak German. "I just wanted a nice casual place to drink beer," he says. "My goal is for everybody to get together and drink some beer and have a good time." He'd like to see younger people coming to the club and becoming active members, carrying on German traditions. In addition to the commendable work they do at the club, Mark and Alwine are "bottle feeders" for Path 4 Paws charity, taking in rescue puppies that are too young to eat on their own and raising them until they can be put up for adoption.
