Kerri Clark sits proudly atop what may be considered her legacy as 2004-2005 president of the German-American Club, those 10 endearing bar stools that fostered outrageous late-night into early-morning drunkenness at Bernie’s Bar. She acquired them at a discount of about \$100 each, and they stand today as a testament to their durability, having supported tons of weighty Germans over the years. Born and raised in Las Vegas, Kerri parlayed her athleticism at Rancho High into a golf scholarship at Weber State University, later earning a spot on the LPGA tour and women’s European tour. Even with physical limitations that come with age, she remains the club’s top golfer, attests fellow golfer Alex Kraus. “Bill Bowman was president when I started. He found out I was a professional golfer and was all over it,” Kerri says. “I walked on water with him. So, he said let’s get a golf group together.” The Bowman-Clark memorial golf trophy was named in honor of Bill Bowman and Rick Clark, Kerri’s late brother. Kerri was also vice president and member-at-large for the club, and she spent quite a few years behind the bar when the club was open seven days a week. “Older members would come in and I loved talking to the old guys about Germany. I was young then and they liked having a girl behind the bar. They were just fun to talk to.” Kerri brought her mother, Mary Ellen, to the club one night and wanted to roll the dice for drinks, but she had to be a member. “I said, ‘How much?’ I joined to roll the dice and I’ve been a member ever since. The key thing is my mom and dad loved this club, and so do I.”
