She volunteers for Oktoberfest and Maifest, and along with her companion, Jesse, has perfected rolling apple strudel dough so thin you can read newspaper print through it. They're also amazing artists, having met at an art gallery. Jesse asked another artist, German-American Club member Rosa Coolbaugh, where they could hear live music, and she directed him to the club. Here, they found friendship that reaffirms our faith in humanity. "We both had long marriages and we had to establish new friends along the way," Linda says. She claims 31 percent German heritage, probably from her dad's side of the family, though her great-grandfather on her mother's side was Charles Wilhelm Schulz. One activity Linda would like to see added at the club is German cooking classes, taught by some of our excellent German lady cooks. Hailing from Omaha, Neb., Linda is engrained with the Midwest work ethic, and aside from Jesse stepping on her toes while dancing, they comprise quite a team. "We just participate in whatever we can to keep the club going."

It is the German version of Mardi Gras and often referred to as the "Fifth Season." It is celebrated between November 11 and Fat Tuesday. During this time, it is considered appropriate for the people to mock their religious and political institutions. Karneval mocks the government with its Prinz and Prinzessin (King and Queen), Elferrat (Council) and Hofdamen (Ladies of the Court). This celebration dates to medieval times. Costumes and masks are faire during the different fetes.
