In June, I cleaned and restored the room, and moved our decorations into labeled bins. Tables were cleared and the office was restored. IMPROVEMENTS & REPAIRS

Over the past 12 months, our club has undergone costly repairs. While the \$9,000 total cost has deeply challenged our cash reserves, we now have a safer and more comfortable *Haus*.

The repairs were contracted when necessary, and done by members when possible. Members have appreciated the repaired flower boxes, new bathroom faucets, fresh paint on the front doors and interior trim, the new towel dispensers, and the improved exterior and interior lighting.

In June, the Chicken Rotisserie got a nice new flue. Scheduled testing and service was completed on the seven smoke detectors, and on the emergency lighting fixtures. The kitchen sink drain-pipes, the outside water faucets, and the rear door hinges were all repaired (*Erstaunlich, die Tür schließt von selbst!*)

The next phase of building restorations are smaller, and include functional things. We will make small system repairs. The *Biergarten*, and our ceiling vents will each receive attention. New area lighting, sound, and stage design improvements are coming.

As your President, I am committed to reporting on repairs in every newsletter. All members need to understand these projects, in order to appreciate the true costs and the hard work of our weekly volunteers. I will also encourage every reader to consider making a "GASCON Repair Donation" to support their work, to restore our cash reserves, and to assure that timely maintenance preserves this special Hall for the members that will follow us
