IMPROVEMENTS & REPAIRS

The Club has received a new security camera system. The previous system no longer had manufacturer support.

The system was purchased through Amazon for \$349.99 and arrived July 25th. Installation may be sped up if we are be able to use existing wiring.

When set-up, all Board Members will have equal and continuous access to the eight cameras live-video feed either via phone or computer from anywhere, 24 hours.

The Club is seeking ceiling-mounted LED light pots for stage illumination. Currently, there are only two recessed canister lights. We need to be able to set more dynamic lighting. We also need sound muffling wall and floor baffle materials to reduce vibrations that disturb entertainers. Please see Eric if you have any equipment or suggestions.

There was damage to the *Biergarten* fence in late July. This is being assessed for repair.

Finally, last month I encouraged members to consider making direct donations towards Club repair. I want to thank those that have made gifts towards this purpose. I am again encouraging every reader to offer a "GASCON Repair Donation" of \$1-100 to grow our Reserve Account.
