President's Letter

Guten Tag,

We have completed a wonderful holiday season and have closed 2023. From the *Oktoberfest*, thru the Halloween Party, Prom Night, Thanksgiving Dinner, Krampus Visit, Christmas Party (with a visit from Mrs Claus), Potlucks and our New Year's Eve Party, we have shared good food, music, and fun. On behalf of the Board, I want to thank everyone that has volunteered. It has been a joy to see the enthusiasm of members volunteering to accomplish the above.

As this season closes, the Board encourages members to consider joining the standing activities of our Club, like German Dancing (weekly practice starts in March), Card/Golf Play, and monthly Schützen. For those with a playful nature, join the Las Vegas Vagabonds (Erika/Alex!!).

Financially, the corporation has about \$2,500 more than our July 1st balance, which is roughly a 10% gain. I consider this a success, given that we have doubled weekly events, created new activities, purchased equipment, made repairs and paid down taxes due and supplier accounts. We have slowed the cash losses that persistently followed COVID. Also, our positive financial trajectory may be sustained with revenue from the 2024 dinner price changes (See Article on page 4).

So what about our next 6 months? We have begun *Maifest* work, and Saturday meal planning through June 30th. St. Valentine's and St. Patrick's Day dinners are still ahead, and we have a fundraiser for St. Baldrick's on Feb 18th. Membership Meetings will continue on the 3rd Saturday with Chicken Dinners and Karaoke. However, in January, as we host the Intn'I Skat Players Association Tournament, our membership meeting will move to the 4th Saturday, Jan 27th. Thanks to Art Ruckle, Skip and others, for volunteering to cook for us, and our guests.

IMPROVEMENTS & REPAIRS

There were no significant repairs made in December. We have scheduled a maintenance and inspection service call for the Kitchen ovens. We want to make sure that the Oven Temperatures are calibrated.

The recent remodel by Burger King has had a positive benefit for our Club. Their bright new LED Lot Lights have added security to our parking area, particularly near our trash can. Their pole light near our bin was out for the last few years. After their repairs, we have a light over our bin - Thanks Burger King!

A new aluminum, all-weather table, on industrial caster wheels, has been added to the inventory of outdoor cooking equipment. It replaces the old, broken top, square wood table that was disposed in September. It has a large recessed bowl space for marinating meats, or to hold/serve food at events. The service/prep table was donated by President Outfleet to further the 2023 improvements made in the Back Patio / Bar-B-Que area. Member #4668.

Recently, the wooden patio table was moved to the Beer Garden "Smoking Area" and this has improved "traffic safety" in the kitchen/food service hall-way.
